Important Information About the Spring Men's Walk

Greetings Great Smoky Mountain Chrysalis and Emmaus Communities. The Spring Men's Walk is quickly coming! The Board voted and passed the following at the board retreat on the January 9th. We must have 20 pilgrim applications with payment by 30 days out or we will not be able to have the Men's Walk. That date is February 9th. We must be responsible financially as a community. We need to know we are going to have at least 20 men in order to pay for the weekend. If you are prayerfully sponsoring pilgrims, having the reservation in by 2/9/2010 should not be a problem. We will continue to accept applications with full payment up to 2 weeks prior to the walk. After that point, any applicants will go on a waiting list for the next walk. Other communities have a 30 day deadline for a full walk. Again, if you are being a responsible sponsor, then this should not be a problem.

Greetings from the Great Smoky Mountain Emmaus Community

I grew up in the church. I have wonderful memories of Sunday School teachers and flannel board stories. My mother would make be beautiful dresses and take me to church wearing white gloves and shiny shoes. I enjoyed "playing church" as a little girl. I participated in youth group when I was old enough. I attended Campus Crusade for Christ meetings and was part of the "God Squad" at my high school. I was a "good girl". But I was just playing church. I accepted Christ as my Savior at a Billy Graham Crusade in 1972 here is Knoxville. I grew up, married, had a family, took them to church and continued to "play church". But I did not understand what God had planned for me. It wasn't until I was able to get a better understanding of how God wants to live in me, work through me and reach others for Him through me. You see God has a plan. God's plan will be realized. His will will be done. I can either choose to let God work in and through me and be a part of a great adventure, or I can miss out on the adventure of leading the Christian life. It is up to me.

That is the first paragraph in the talk I gave on Christian Action on one of the Emmaus Weekends. As the community prepares to start planning for the fall walks, I would like to issue a challenge to the Great Smoky Mountain Emmaus Community. I would like for you to prayerfully consider working a weekend. I know that you have a busy life. We all have busy lives. But you know what, God still expects you to serve Him. The GSMEC still needs you. Working a weekend is a great way to renew and rejuvenate your Emmaus experience. Every weekend I have worked has been a blessing to me. It has taken time and sacrifice, I have had to "prioritize". But it has all been worth it.

The goal is to have 1/3 (eight) with experience on 4 or more walks, 1/3 (eight) with experience on 2 or 3 walks, and 1/3 (eight) with no or 1 walk experience .The conference room team members should represent the Community geographically and denominationally. Preference should be given to persons who participate in an Emmaus reunion group. Pilgrims should not be considered for a Conference Room team position until they have had an opportunity to serve in behindthe-scenes Walk activities (i.e.- Sponsor's Hour, Candlelight, Closing, dining room and kitchen, outside Agape Team). This means that a person should not be considered for the next team named after completion of their walk. Team positions require progressive experience/service in other positions. This applies to GSMEC pilgrims, Chrysalis youth and adults, and to new Community members transferring from another community, regardless of their service there.

There is a team selection standing rule guideline that we are striving to follow. Please help us by serving in behind the scenes Walk activities, by prayerfully considering a request to serve in the conference room if you are asked, and by making Agape gifts and food and by praying.

Take time to contact Mike and Suzy Ooten or Marcia Malin. They are all part of the team selection committee. Or contact any board member. Let us know what you feel led to do. Don't miss out on the adventure God has in store for you.

Report from Walk #81

First of all I would like to thank everyone for the continued prayer before and during the walk. We felt your prayers during the entire weekend. Thanks to all who served during the weekend. You all helped everything come into play. Thanks to a great conference- room team that was willing to do anything to better serve the Lord and to make my job easier and fun. Thanks to all the pilgrims for not anticipating but participating and for spending a special weekend with God. Thanks to all the sponsors for sponsoring pilgrims. Sponsorship is what keeps the Walk to Emmaus the great thing that it is. Thanks to my father, Ken Abbott, for serving as spiritual director. Most of all thank you, God, for Your continued blessings on us.

Preparing for Walk 81 was definitely a job. The hardest thing was recruiting the team, but I could not have asked for a better one. Everyone was willing to do whatever it took to get the job done. While recruiting the team I became nervous because as our first meeting drew near, we still didn't have everybody that we needed. Even after our meetings had started, we had to make some adjustments on the team.

When our first team meeting started, I was so much at ease because I could feel the presence of a great team God provided for Walk 81. In that first meeting we previewed five talks; I have never seen that happen before with other teams that I have served on. I want to make a note that all the other teams I served on were great and that I am not putting any of the others down at all. The team meetings were a lot of fun with a fun-loving bunch of men praising the Lord. That first meeting set the tone for a lot of fun with a fairly fast pace. I think we barely made the required hours for team preparation. One thing I know for sure is everyone who did a talk got the one best suited for him. Unfortunately one of our team members had to drop off of the team because of health issues, but he is now doing better.

Now how do I talk about the Walk itself in a paragraph or two? It looked as if we were going to have a full walk at first, but we had about five or six drop out, three of them at the last minute. One of our pilgrims, Foster Cather, was 94 years old at the time of the walk. When we got started Thursday night everything seemed to go according to plan. Everyone was already laughing a lot during "My New Friend." It was great to see everyone having a good time. The

"script" says for the lay director and spiritual director to introduce each other, but that felt a little awkward since the spiritual director is my dad. Because of that we thought we would surprise each other for the interesting fact we knew of each other. I believe everyone got a kick out of that.

In our usual fashion we took off at a fast pace on Friday. We were ahead of schedule quite a bit. Everyone was having a blast. When we were singing, great harmony filled the conference room. I don't mean to sound cruel, but it's a good thing they could sing because they sure couldn't draw. Each table had a different interpretation of the talks that were still right on the money. There were more skits than usual. That night Dad had to stay longer than usual in the sanctuary because pilgrims were really feeling what God was doing for them. Dad told me he had never seen so many people open up so early on any walk. He didn't make it to our team meeting that night.

Our team meeting for Friday night is a subject in itself. As we were preparing for Saturday, one of our table leaders collapsed suddenly. His blood pressure dropped, causing his blood sugar to rise. He was rushed to the hospital by ambulance. Four of our team members went to the hospital to make sure everything would be all right. The two table leaders who went to the hospital were witnessing to people in the ER waiting room. If that is not Christian action, I don't know what is.

On Saturday for our morning prayers we laid hands on the men of the table and prayed that their table leader would have a quick recovery and be back. He returned later that afternoon and was welcomed back with open arms. The enemy tried to get us down, but he only made us stronger. I'm glad we have two ALD2's because one was definitely needed to fill in as a table leader for a while on Saturday. Dying moments was extremely powerful. These men died to many things they had been living with for much too long. After dying moments whatever deer-in-the-headlight look was there was now completely gone. It was smooth sailing the rest of the way. We had a lot of fun with "poster review" or "quality control." We were all laughing and having our fun, but our eyes were also opening to how much we are all loved by our savior Jesus Christ. Candlelight was a totally blessed surprise for everyone, especially when they had found out how far people had driven for that.

Welcome to your forth day! Forth day is an intricate part of your walk as a pilgrim. You have spent 72 hours experiencing the "love of God in Christ "through His servants, then as most good things do those 72 hours came to an end and you found yourself in the midst of hours 73, 74, 75 and so on. 

Words from the Community Lay Director

A team comprises a group of people linked in a common purpose. Teams are especially appropriate for conducting tasks that are high in complexity and have many interdependent subtasks. A group in itself does not necessarily constitute a team. Teams normally have members with complementary skills and generate synergy through a coordinated effort which allows each member to maximize his or her strengths and minimize his or her weaknesses. Are you interested in leading a Walk to Emmaus and feel called to do so?

Every Emmaus Weekend is made up of a team. The process of getting a team together is not a simple one I have learned! We have a team selection committee and a team selection board member who oversees the process. There are guidelines that must be followed. It is not as simple as saying "I think so and so would be good at...." Team selection for every walk begins at least 6 months prior to the walk. A Lay Director and a Lay Director 1 (in training) must be in place before the team selection committee will meet to pray and discuss who will be asked to serve in the various positions for the upcoming walk. Prayerful discernment of God's plan for each team down to each and every individual member He wants to serve and the exact position He wants them to be asked to serve in is the goal of the team selection committee.

Each team is made up of many positions. Those positions include 8 table leaders, 8 assistant table leaders, 2 to serve as an ALD 2, an Agape Team leader and 6 to 8 team members, two to three prayer chapel people, and the music leader and team. The GSMEC follows a model of progressive servanthood. A person's readiness to carry out his or her particular

assignment effectively often depends on and is always enhanced by prior experience gained by working other Walk related positions. The progression of responsibilities starts with support roles (agape, kitchen, set-up, outside team) and then moves into the conference room.

Please give prayerful consideration to being on a team even if you don't meet all of the requirements at the moment. The GSMEC Board can help you receive the proper training and gain the right experience through progressive servanthood until the one day you are selected to lead a Walk. Listen to God's voice and know that He will call you to lead a Walk at the right time for you and according to His plan. It's a big job, with lots of responsibility, but remember you'll have more Christians than you can count ready to help at a moment's notice. As always, "it's a God thing" and it always works out because as it states in Matthew 19:26 "with God all things are possible."



Good News, Bad News, Who's To Say?

Good news, bad news, who's to say? This a line from an old Chinese proverb used in a sermon I heard lately. (Yes the bible was used too) The punch line, or moral of the story, is that sometimes when we hear «news» we say «that's bad news.» But who is to say if it is good news or bad news? Sometimes something that appears to be bad news turns out to be good news and vice versa. Perhaps that is how we need to think about change. There is a lot of talk about what we used to do in Emmaus and what we do now. Change happens. Whether we like it or not, whether we want it or not, change happens.

On June 12th, several members of the GSMEC Board attended the Leadership Training Class in Chattanooga. There we learned just how well Mike Ooten had educated us on why we do what we do and why some things we do need(ed) to change. I guess the one thing I want to say is that I recognize that there is the way we used to do it and the way we need to do it now. I have been on walks that were run the old way and more in line with the «right way». I did not notice a hugh difference as a team member and I am betting that the pilgrims on the walks certainly did not know that «that's not the way we used to do it». We have a model that has guidelines we need to follow if we are to call ourselves an Emmaus Community. There is a reason things are done a certain or particular way and we must always remember that. Our jobs require guidelines, our churches have guidelines, our families have guidelines, our lives have guidelines. Most guidelines are not stagnant, but change. We need to follow the guidelines, even when we don't like something about them. If we don't every weekend will take on a life of it's own that reflects the team's personality and not the purpose it was designed for. «The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being «a servant of all.» from The Upper Room Website.

The Walk to Emmaus calls forth and renews us in Christian discipleship. On an Emmause weekend we take a look at New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. highly structured weekend is designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people and, through them, their families, congregations, and the world in which they live. The focus of Walk to Emmaus is God, as known in Jesus Christ, and how that finds expression in the local church. The objective of Walk to Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, and places of work. So let's stop worrying about how we used to do it. Let's accept the changes and move on with furthering the kingdom of God and Jesus Christ in our world. «Good news, bad news; who's to say?»

Encouragement for your Fourth Day!

Greetings Brothers & Sisters,

Blessings to you all. I have a heavy heart and want to share it with you requesting your prayers on my behalf that I may be given wisdom to know how I can do my part to help fix this problem that I see. With that said, I guess I need to identify the problem. Here it is. Our last Gathering for the Emmaus community was Saturday, June 12, 2010. Out of a Community of about 4,000 members we had 28 members present. Don't get me wrong, even though we was few in number the fellowship was great, the food (as always) was awesome and we had a great time of Worship & Praise...BUT! It seems to me that in a Community of about 4000 members, WE CAN DO BETTER! AMEN????

I am reminded of a marque in front of a church that read "Jesus adds & multiplies, Satan subtracts and divides. The more I thought about it the more I found that to be a very profound statement. You see it is very Biblical. There is in the Bible 58 "one another commands," not suggestions, of Scripture that tells us how God our Father wants His children to live in relationship to "ONE ANOTHER" Here are a few of them for your encouragement. Hebrews 10:25 "Let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds all the more as we see the day drawing near", Romans 12: 10 Be Devoted to one another in brotherly love" same verse, Honor one another above yourselves. Galatians 6:2 "Carry one another's burdens". Galatians 5:13 "Serve one another in love." Just to name a few. Jesus said in John, ". . . they will know that you are mine by the way you have love for one another" At the last Gathering I had the privilege of sharing a 4th day talk with the family and I would like to share a condensed version of that talk to hopefully encourage you.

Let me ask you to go back in your mind to the Thursday evening you showed up with your sponsor for your walk. You came into the dinning room and saw a bunch of people you did not know from Adam or Eve. Got a plate of food and went with your sponsor and found a place to sit among a bunch of people you did not know from Adam or Eve. And there you sat with about 31 other pilgrims and you all had that "deer in the headlights" look on your faces. Then after a short time, you were herded off, up to the Sanctuary where they called you out by name and had you come

down and stand in front of all of these people that you didn't know from Adam or Eve, then you was escorted out of the building and walked around the block and back into a small conference room. The next thing you know, your standing in front of all these people that you don't know from Adam or Eve introducing you " NEW BEST FRIEND" that you didn't know from _ _ __ or _ _ and somehow, it wasn't so bad. I mean, you started to realize that everyone in the room was in the same boat that you were in. And your weekend began. Remember? The messages about the Grace of our Lord, working out your thoughts as a team on posters or in song or maybe a skit. The times of silent meditation. Bonding with the people at your table, establishing friendships that will last down through the years and possibly even into eternity. Meeting separately together around the Lord table as you took Holy Communion and the weekend just kept getting better and better. The food, fellowship, your letters etc... Then, as all good things do, Sunday evening came and that cocoon of God's love that you found yourself wrapped in burst. It was time to come out of your cocoon and spread your wings and go back into the world or as we affectionately call it in the Emmaus Community start your 4th day. Are you with me? How did that work for you?

Next was my personal testimony which for the sake of this letter I will spare you the details but here's the short version. My walk was March of 2009, it was incredible, it totally blew me away. What was the culmination of 5 years of prodding to get me to go on this walk finally bore fruit. As much as I hated to see the weekend come to an end, I couldn't wait to get home to encourage my wife to go on the next walk in April which she did. As I had hoped, she came away from her walk with the same conviction as I did. We both wanted to be very involved in the Emmaus Community. So we could help as many people experience the quality of a walk that we did. So we made a commitment to serve in the Community as much as we can. You have to know that when you make a commitment to do something to bring honor and/or glory to God, the evil one is going to be right there to do what he can to stop you.

As I said, my walk was in March, my wife was in April, we committed to serve. On May 30, 2009 I was playing golf with a group of brothers from the Church where I worship. I leaned out of the golf cart to pick up a golf ball as we passed by. I felt a pull, heard a snap like my bone in my arm broke and sat up only to

realize that I had detached my left bicep muscle. That resulted in a reattachment surgery on June 11, 2009 and took me out of work for the following 14 weeks. It healed but not properly. I couldn't rotate my arm because in the healing process I deposited too much calcium. The cure, another surgery to scrape away the excess bone that had formed. That happened on Dec. 28, 2009. The good news, I would be out of work only one week which was the week between Christmas and New Years and the company that I worked for closed that week anyway. So I came back to work on Jan. 2, 2010 worked three weeks only to find out on Wednesday the 27th that the company was closing their doors on the 29th. I have been unemployed since. But I am still here. Praise the Lord!

I shared that testimony to encourage you all. We all go through stuff because the evil one does not want God to receive Glory by or through any of us. So if you're not getting heckled by the evil one . . . ? and if you are, hear the words to this song by the Crabb Family, they are powerful. The song is called "Through the Fire" the lyric says, "He never promised that the cross would not be heavy or the hill would not be hard to climb, He never offered victories without fighting, but He said help would always come in time. Just remember when your standing in the valley of decision and the adversary says GIVE IN, JUST HOLD ON! OUR LORD WILL SHOW UP, AND HE WILL TAKE YOU THROUGH THE FIRE AGAIN."

And so I say brothers and sisters, don't give up, just hold on, stay close to the Lord and to the family and together we will make it through. I will sum it up by sharing this. What has pulled Beth and I through is God, by His Grace and Mercy and You, His family, my family. In short I will sum up by saying this. Follow the Lord by obeying the greatest and 2nd commands. Love God, love each other. In John 15:13 it says, "No greater love has any man than this, that one would lay down his life for a friend. You are my friends, if you do what I command you." And in 1 John 3:16 it says, "Because He laid down His life for us we ought to lay down our life for our brothers." Truly, we are family, lets act like it!



Would you like to be a team member on an upcoming walk?

We have a sign in sheet for the Dining Room and Kitchen. Agape keeps track of who comes in and helps them as well. To work a walk according to Emmaus, you need to have substantial experience behind the scenes on a weekend. You don't have to spend the weekend, but you do need to be there for most of the time.

Did you know that a team is made up of 1/3 with no conference room experience, 1/3 with one walk experience and 1/3 with more than 1 or 2 walk experience? Due to the makeup of the conference room, there are times that we have to overlook the experience rule a bit so be sure your name goes on the sign in sheets if you want to work in the conference room.

Agapé

When asked about my Emmaus experience I often describe it as a "love fest." I had never experienced the love of the Body as I did during my Walk. I was overwhelmed by the visible and the invisible, the deeds performed by strangers as statements of love for me. From the prayer vigil to poems taped to the bathroom mirrors, to the gifts placed on my pillow, or at my dinner plate. We refer to these tokens as "agape," but in truth all efforts were acts of agape. Every hour given to setting rooms, preparing meals, cleaning sinks and toilets—every minute was selflessly offered to serve my fellow pilgrims and me in love. That's Agape Love.

Agape is an active love. It is unconditional giving—nothing is expected in return. It involves a sacrifice of something personal and precious—talent, time, and resources. It is the living expression of God's love for us. Because He first loved us, we love in return. How could we not?

While agape is expressed in countless ways, the table/pillow agape serves as a tangible reminder of God's continuing love long after the pilgrim returns home. The power of His love reaches out through the broken, flawed world in the form of a small trinket—by itself, inadequate, but when offered by faithful believers, it becomes a statement of His Mighty Love. The reverence must be respected, but giving table/pillow agape also offers the opportunity for frivolous fun. A gift that demonstrates wit, practicality, or foresight clearly states that message of unconditional love.

So how can you express your love for the Pilgrims through agape?

First, follow the KISS method – Keep It Simple, uh, Sister (or brother!) It's best not to get bogged down turning out elaborate knickknacks because so many pieces are needed (a minimum of 40 items is needed for each batch). And a batch must contain identical items. But simplifying the process does not detract from the purpose. Attaching a magnet to an object or a scripture verse to a piece of candy will convey your message of affection. Writing a poem or devotional will communicate your personalized love offering. Ideas may come from your own walk: was there a talk that inspired you? Tie an agape gift to the theme or the scripture of that talk. Your reminder gift may help someone Grow Through Study or live the life of Christian Action. Is there something that would be helpful to the pilgrims? Gifts for the conference room, such as pencils or bottles of water, may actually serve a functional purpose. I laughed when I found earplugs on my pillow that first night—but what a blessing they turned out to be! Were you impressed with a table setting during one of the meals? Coordinate a gift to fit the colors or meal theme. Inspiration for agape can also strike while walking the aisles of craft departments or discount stores. What scripture comes to mind when you see a book of matches? Look around your own home-what's in that junk drawer? How many verses can be tied to nail or a battery or a rubber band?

Finally, if you are truly stuck for an idea we have loaded pictures of some Agape gifts used on previous walks on the GSMEC website. There you will also find a list of ideas to spark your creativity. Another great resource is fellowship with long time community members. Over the years, we have had some really beautiful gifts and some of the "older" members will be happy to share ideas with you.


Once you've assembled the pieces, attached the verses, offered your personal blessings, the final fitting for your agape gift is your prayer over it. Ask God for open hearts and receptive minds so that your gift is accepted as love. Pray for peace among the men and women, for unity among the tables. Pray that the blessings you received on your Walk be increased with each successive Walk to Emmaus.

Agape Tips

- In order to provide the same gift to everyone the following quantities are requested: 60 for the conference room/dining room.
 40 for the pillow (pilgrims only)
 Remember that if you don't send enough even by one gift (for example 39 instead of 40) we will not be able to use any of your gifts. All gifts must be identical.
- 2. Please bring gifts to the Agape room no later than noon on Friday so all gifts can be counted, sorted, and scheduled for delivery at the most appropriate time of the walk.
- 3. If you would like your gift delivered at a certain time during the walk (for example, after a certain talk) please place the gifts in some container (bag, box, etc.) and clearly mark those instructions on the container. In a perfect world, the Agape team would remember that you told them what time to deliver the gift but, if you have ever worked Agape for a weekend you KNOW that won't happen!
- 4. If you just don't feel creative or don't have time to make a gift, please

remember we also need snacks for the Pilgrims – this is Agape too! Please follow the same "by Friday at noon schedule" for the snacks as well. This helps the team to plan what snacks for what time and really eliminates stress of not enough as well as waste.

5. Please keep in mind the gender of the pilgrims on the walk. On women's weekends, pink razors or pens with flowers glued to them will be well received, but on the men's weekend – not so much. Most men just don't appreciate the beauty of a rose taped to a bookmark while most of us women don't understand anything with a fishing lure on it. Just keep in mind what would be Agape love to whatever particular gender is walking that weekend.

Day Four The Pilgrim's Continued Journey Your Emmaus experience was three days

Your Emmaus experience was three days long. The rest of you life will be a succession of Fourth days. You are asked to live Day Four as intentionally as the three days of the Emmaus Walk, accompanied by a growing desire to become a wiling and joyful servant of God.

The Walk to Emmaus was not the beginning of your Christian pilgrimage. Rather, the Walk is like coming into a movie that is already in progress. There were and are and will be many important factors in your faithful living. Family, friends, congregations, special events and ministry—all these have been a part of your Christian development. God has worked through a multitude of channels to share grace and love with you.

The call to serve God and to serve with enthusiasm comes in the midst of many other demands and priorities. Any relationship that is not given priority soon becomes meaningless if not lost altogether. Our yes to God is not a once-and-for-all event. The sole purpose of the Emmaus movement is to strengthen disciples within the ministry of individual congregations. Emmaus is a partnership with the church to inspire its leaders to become more effective and intentional in their ministry. The unique role of the Walk to Emmaus is spiritual renewal.

The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of that community's recruiting practices. If the community is committed to recruiting strong church leaders for the purpose of strengthening the local church, then the community will be a strong, vital force in the renewal movement. The Emmaus community needs to be about providing authentic spiritual renewal.

We need to remember Day Four. After a pilgrim attends the Walk, we should not forget about them. Spend some time together. Help your Pilgrim digest the experience. Give the person direction to his or her new found

enthusiasm about being a disciple. Help the Pilgrim take those first steps of discipleship in the right direction so that no one become alienated from the person of from the Walk to Emmaus. Make sure your friend gets in a reunion group. If you are not in a reunion group, go along. Bring the Pilgrim to the first Emmaus community gathering following the Walk.

Help the Pilgrim understand Emmaus. Help the person to understand how he or she can serve the Emmaus community. Talk about signing up for the prayer vigil, serving in the kitchen, volunteering agape for the tables and for snacks, and serving on teams. Entry into serving on the Emmaus teams is through the servant's entrance.

The ultimate reason you should want to recruit a person is Christ's love for you wanting that same love for the prospective Pilgrim. This is serious work, building the kingdom of God, and building a strong Emmaus community is part of this task.

Fourth Day

The king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to the one of these of who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40).

We return home from Weekends glowing in the light of love found there. All too soon, the world is not cooperating. We want everyone to feel as exhilarated and exhausted as we do. This dynamic happens whether we are a new pilgrim or a team member. We want the Emmaus atmosphere to be present always. But it's not going to happen.

How do we keep the "high"? Surely, Peter, James, and John wanted to keep the powerful Transfiguration event alive. Peter suggested they build three booths: one for Jesus, one for Elijah, and one for Moses. They would stay on the mountaintop forever. We know that Jesus' transfiguration was the revealing event that proved the Law and the Prophets were complete in him. God sealed this vision by saying, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" (Mark9:7).

Christ is re-presented to us on Weekends. We are told that whatever we do in love, even if it the least task, we have done it to and for him. Think about the living tasks you do each day. Are you a parent? A custodian? A teacher? A nurse or doctor? A truck driver? A secretary? You may feel that your position in life is not as important as someone else's. But that's not true. All things done in love count for good.

What about Weekends? Do you sign up for the Prayer Vigil? Do you work to prepare meals for the pilgrims and team members? Do you write agape letters to all the pilgrims first? Make writing pilgrim agape letters a priority. (Remember what a living impact they made on you.) Persevere in doing, what some may consider, the least jobs. Setting up for a Weekend and taking down after the closing are just

as important as the lay director's servanthood. Without your work and willingness to serve, the lay director would have nowhere to lead the pilgrims. So work where you can. If done in love, it will glorify God and edify the Body of Christ.

Emmaus has three priorities: to deepen the spiritual growth of pilgrims, to deepen the spiritual growth of those in our congregations, and to let the light of Christ shine brightly in our families, neighborhoods, and wok places. On a Weekend, the first priority has hopefully taken place in us. Now, it is up to us to help deepen the spiritual growth of our brothers and sisters in our homes and churches. As we do that, we reach out to our communities to work where we can to bring the light of Christ to our environments. No matter what least job you do, if done in love, you have done it for and to our Lord.

Question for Reflection: Are you envious because you feel your tasks are less important that the tasks of others?



Christmas is Grace



A passage from Titus summarizes the whole gospel, and points us to the heart and center of Christmas: "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all" (2: 11). It is God's word of grace at the heart and center of Christmas. It is God's word of grace that is the thread that runs throughout Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection. "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all." God is jumping right into our world with the ultimate goal of saving us. God, in Jesus, is coming to us in a way we cannot miss.

Early in my career as a chaplain in the Navy Reserves, I was privileged to attend an awards ceremony at the Coast Guard Air Station in Cape Cod, Mass. Recognitions and medals were presented to personnel stationed there for bravery in sea and mountain rescues. Risking their own lives, these helicopter pilots and crewmen attacked danger in saving the lives of others. Some of those rescued were present, to again express, "thank you for saving my life."

There are situations so serious that the rescue of the drowning person cannot be accomplished with a rope, a life preserver, or simply the presence of a boat or helicopter. Nothing else works but for a rescuer to jump into the water, swim to the person in distress, and risk going down with her or him in the effort to save. This is just what God does for each one of us in Jesus Christ. God knows that nothing else will do. It won't work to talk to us from some safe, heavenly vantage point. It won't work to give us a set of written instructions about how to swim. The waters are too deep and the current too strong. So God jumps into the rough water and comes beside us through Jesus.

There is nothing comfortable or easy about the events on that first Christmas. Mary and Joseph have only a stable in which to birth the baby. Absent from family and friends, the only visitors they have are some shepherds. There is no special treatment for Jesus that night or any other night of his life. When he's about two years old, King Herod will try to kill him and the whole family will have to flee to Egypt for safety. The water is rough. God knows it and is willing to share it with us through Jesus. This is love. This is grace. This is Christmas.
