Putting on My Christmas Socks

It's been one of those Christmas Seasons where I have struggled to get my joy elevator past the first floor. With the recent death of my Mom, I have been stuck in the grief delay that happens when you find yourself being a Pastor/caregiver for the family in the services and estate management. Add to this the number of routine Christmas Season congregational and community "needs and challenges" that each Pastor expects, strives to prepare for, and considers not as burdens, but as holy kingdom moments; and I realized as I awoke this morning, where I have been able to campaign joy flowing to others, I have not quite been able to receive a re-stocking of the joy necessary to even prepare for the "next round" or more importantly embrace the Joy of the Season. In such times I find I am at risk of choosing isolation over fellowship. And this reality weighed heavy upon me as I awoke this morning and struggled with how I could even hope to write an article for the Great Smokey Mountain Emmaus Community Newsletter... I asked the Lord for help to restore my joy. As I was dressing and leaned over to put on a brand new pair of Carhartt socks, the Lord provided a memory and I started laughing....

Fifteen years ago, I was completing my Pastoral training taking a unit of Clinical Pastoral Education at Johnson City Medical Center. I was serving as Chaplain on the Cancer Ward and in the midst of a brutal Christmas Season 24-hour on-call shift. I was on assigned rounds and walked into a patient's room and said the stupid thing that all Chaplains know never to say "How are you doing today?" Realizing my error immediately, I started to apologize. But the old man in the room, now grabbing hold of his IV pole to shift from lying in bed to sitting up with his feet and legs dangling but not quite touching the floor interrupted." No sir Preacher! You asked the question and I am going to give you the answer. I feel like crap all the time. The

cancer is spreading quickly to every part of my body. They put a few drain tubes in to keep the tumors from pressuring other parts of my body. I am refusing anything but the basic pain medicine because they tell me the cancer is also now migrating to my brain and I want to be able to communicate as much as I can for as long as I can. They say I probably won't see this Christmas. But you want to know the worst damn thing?" Stunned I nodded my head and he continued " The worst thing is that I have had bad circulation in my feet my whole life; my feet have been cold and in pain my whole life." Then to my surprise I saw the man's countenance shift from pain to great joy. His eyes sparkled and his smile opened from ear to ear and he continued " But with Jesus, there is always good news! I met with my accountant today. I've made arrangements to make sure all my hospital bills are fully paid, and there is enough money left to pay a tithe to the church, and to get Christmas presents for every child, grandchild and great grandchild; every nephew, niece, and cousin. And they are all getting the same kind of present. You want to know what I am getting them?"

Amazed as he openly laughed even as he winched from the pain the laughter caused, I said "What?". Joy now fully flowing to every corner of the room, even shocking the nurse who had overheard the conversation and had entered the room, the old man proclaimed "I know each one's size and I am getting each several pairs of the warmest, best socks that money can buy. I may not be around to help them anymore. But at least they won't have cold feet." The old man took a breath, moved back under the covers and laid back comfortably on the bed. " God is so good preacher man! God is so good! Will you pray with me, and for my family"... And we prayed.

So today I pray "with" each of us, that regardless of what we encounter this Christmas Season, we will each decide to embrace the fullness of Holy Spirit Joy that is available, and put on our Christmas Socks.

May your days be Merry and Bright!..... and your feet warm! -----Preachee
